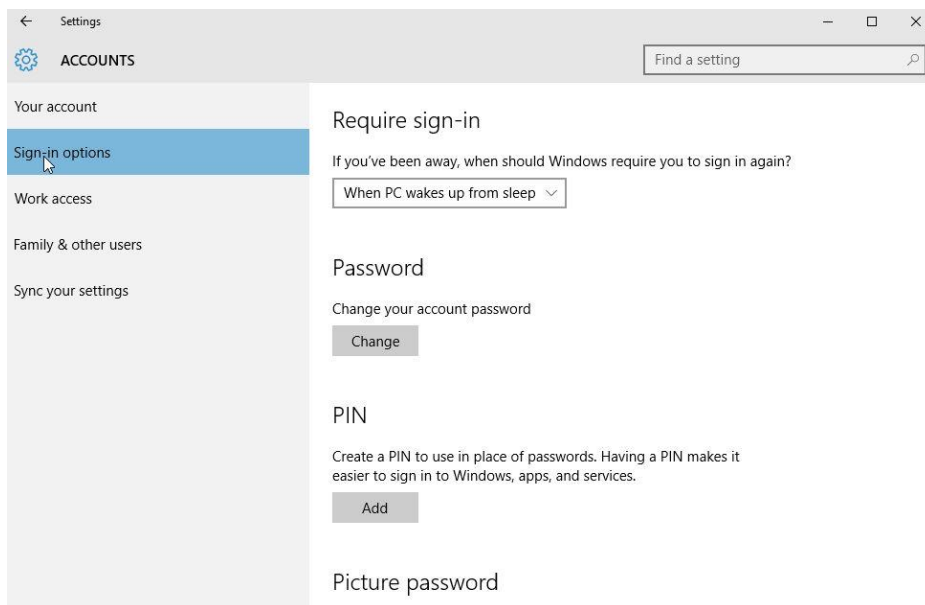
## Using a PIN to sign in to Windows

Hopefully you will have set up your Microsoft account with a strong password. Having to sign in to Windows with that long password every time might be annoying. So you can set up a PIN comprising up to 4 digits to use instead of your password.

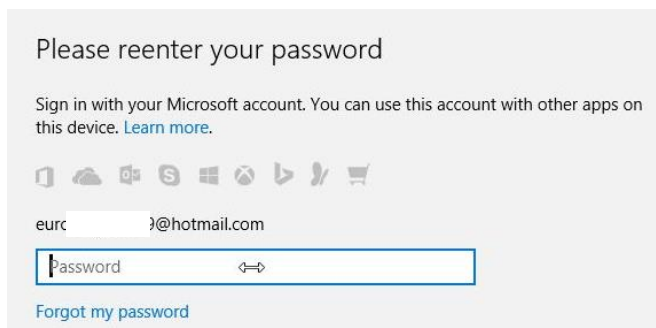
If you didn't set up a PIN during the Upgrade process, here is how to do it from the Start menu.

**If you choose to use a PIN, be aware that you must still remember your long password because you will be asked for that occasionally as a security measure. You will also need your long password to access your account using a browser.**

Go to Settings > Accounts, then choose *Sign in options*



Under PIN click Add. You will then be asked for your long password



Then enter your PIN twice, a maximum of 4 digits, click OK

## Set up a PIN

Create a PIN to use in place of passwords. Having a PIN makes it easier to sign in to your device, apps, and services.
